CAUCUS PROCEDURE

CAUCUS OVERVIEW

A Caucus session involves each District and International candidate **delivering a speech outlining their objectives.** Following each speech, candidates will **address questions from members.** Candidate will receive the same amount of time allocated to present themselves. All candidates running for District Office or International Endorsement will appear in the Caucus Session during their designated time.

CAUCUS INFORMATION

Arriving early is crucial, as the Caucus session will commence promptly. The role of moderating Caucus will be assumed by the Policy, International Business, & Elections (PIE) Chair, with members of the PIE Committee acting as assistants.

The PIE Committee Mentor will serve as the adult moderator, supporting the PIE Chair in maintaining order. These moderators will be responsible for timing the candidates and determining the appropriateness of questions.

CAUCUS ETIQUETTE

Candidates must not be touched, requested to consume any substance, or encouraged to engage in any **inappropriate behavior**. There should be no throwing or launching of objects by any means during the Caucus session. Any form of rude behavior will be met with zero tolerance.

Individuals are **not permitted to enter or exit the room while candidates are present**. This is only allowed during the designated breaks or transition times. However, it is recommended that you refrain from doing so until the Caucus session concludes.

HOUSE OF DELEGATES PROCEDURE

HOUSE OF DELEGATES OVERVIEW

At the House of Delegates, candidates will deliver their **final statements by responding to a set of questions from the current position holders.** Following this, delegates will cast their final votes by ballot for their preferred candidate. Delegates may only vote for **one (1) candidate**.

NOMINATING CONFERENCE

If there are **more than two candidates** for District Office, International President endorsement, or International Vice President endorsement, **or more than four candidates** seeking International Trustee endorsement, a **Nominating Conference will be conducted.**

Candidates will be presented and voted on in the specified sequence: Governor, Secretary, Treasurer, and International Endorsement. **No speeches or questions will be given during this process.**

Following the Nominating Conference, **two final candidates** for each Executive position and a maximum of **four endorsement candidates** will be **listed on the final ballot**.

INTERNATIONAL ENDORSEMENT

A district can endorse one candidate for the office of International President or International Vice President and up to two candidates for the office of International Trustee. If there is only one candidate for endorsement, delegates will vote "yes" or "no" for endorsement.

SPECTATORS

A **spectator section** for non-delegate members and adult chaperones will be provided. Spectators may **not** sit with or talk to the delegates, nor take part in the process. **Silence** must be observed at all times.

CAUCUS QUESTIONS & FAQS

CAUCUS QUESTIONS

ACCEPTABLE QUESTIONS

Relate to a candidate's qualifications, platform, experience, plans, and goals. Examples:

- How will you balance this position with school, family, and other extracurricular activities?
- What is your strongest leadership skill and how will you apply this to serve your members?
- What have you learned from observing the current member in office and how will this affect your term, if elected?
- Out of all the core values, which one is your favorite and how will you apply it?
- What past experience have you had that helped you prepare to run for this position?
- How will you voice the membership's opinions and ideas?
- What is your weakest quality and how will you work to improve it through this position?
- How do you plan on holding yourself accountable for the various tasks you will have?

UNACCEPTABLE QUESTIONS

Reference irrelevant or inappropriate topics or are related to sex, religion, race, or politics. Examples:

- What is the address of the CNH Kiwanis District Office?
- Why are you better than [insert candidate name]?
- How do you feel?

FAQS

COMMON QUESTIONS

- If my home club did not register delegates online prior to DCON, can I still register as a delegate? Yes, members are still able to register at the designated Delegate Registration Booth on-site during District Convention.
- Are there any pre-election functions that members should be attending? Members are encouraged to attend Candidate Meet & Greet on Friday.
- Before caucus begins, are rules/procedures/other information shared with the attendees? The Policy, International, and Elections Committee hosts the election and releases guidelines for caucus questions in the Candidates Booklet.
- Is there an introduction of candidates or list read off before the elections of the candidates? Candidates each create one-page literatures that are included in this booklet. Candidates are announced as they enter the room. They are also introduced during the first general session on Friday.
- When will the results be announced? Results are announced during General Session 3.
- When do the elected officials begin their term? Immediately following installation on Sunday morning.

GENERAL

- Provide an example of a time you experienced a leadership struggle. How did you address this?
- How has Key Club shaped your perspective on community service?
- What is one area of improvement for the District and how will you address it?
- How will you promote diversity, equity, and inclusiveness?
- How will you handle criticism?

GOVERNOR

- In what new ways will you use the District Committees to promote organizational growth?
- How will you effectively represent the interests of the CNH District at the International level?
- What new resources will you create to support club officers, specifically Presidents and Vice Presidents?

SECRETARY

- How will you keep yourself accountable for managing DMRF submissions and other reports in accordance with deadlines?
- What would you consider to be the biggest challenge of a Club Secretary and how will you address this?
- How will you enforce the integrity of a service hour within CNH?

TREASURER

- How will you decrease reliance on division-level fundraisers and strengthen club-level fundraisers?
- What new methods will you use to promote club reactivation and recovery from inactivity?
- Attending District Convention can be very expensive. How will you guide clubs in raising funds to subsidize costs for members?

INTERNATIONAL

- What is your strategy for addressing the needs of smaller versus larger districts?
- How will you improve communication between the many levels of Key Club International?
- How will you cultivate an organization that embraces inclusivity of clubs located outside the United States?
- How will you work alongside your district pairings?
- How can you translate your skills to improve Key Club International?

GOVERNOR ANNUAL RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Preside at all District Board Training Conferences & Meetings. Aide in the planning of the meeting and prepare an agenda which should be sent out to the board 1-2 weeks before the meeting. Provide a Governor's Report at all board meetings.
- Preside at all Leadership Team meetings and conference calls.
- Complete monthly reports and evaluations for District and International.
- Contribute to the District Newsletter monthly.
- Publish (at least) 10 Board newsletters, 4-6 Club Presidents' newsletters, and 4-6 Club Vice Presidents' newsletters. Newsletter information should contain relevant information to aid them in their positions. Include topics from KCI Distinguished Governor Guidelines.
- Publish two Club Presidents and Club Vice Presidents training manuals, one in the summer and one in the spring.
- Maintain and update a CNH Presidents' and Vice Presidents' email reflector on a regular basis. Update the officers on important deadlines, District and International news, and advice.
- Communicate with the District Administrator at least once a week. The preferred method of communication will be determined by mutual agreement.
- Maintain regular contact with your fellow Executives and encourage them to send out reminders to Lieutenant Governors on a regular basis.
- Maintain regular contact with the District Secretary & Treasurer via Bee Team reflector and other preferable methods of communication.
- Maintain formal, monthly communication with the International Trustee, President, and Vice President, and the CNH Board.
- Attend monthly conference calls for the Bee Team, Leadership Team, and committees.
- Ride the Kiwanis Float in the Rose Float Parade.
- Promote International and District programs & initiatives.
- Provide support for all board members.
- Promote and abide by the District Code of Conduct. Lead by example.
- Promote and abide by policies and guidelines regarding technology use.
- Plan and attend Fall Rally Sessions.

GOVERNOR ANNUAL RESPONSIBILITIES (CONT.):

- Address any disciplinary issues in a timely manner.
- Evaluate performance of all persons on the Board and be prepared to conduct intervention meetings and possibly remove "underperforming" officers while adhering to due process as defined within the District's Bylaws and Policy Manual.
- Perform at least 50 hours of service to the home, school, and community and be a member in good standing in their home club.
- Assign caucus moderators, assign speaking assignments, assist with planning schedule of events, writing scripts, and completion of convention details.
- Judge Distinguished Lieutenant Governor.
- Apply for Distinguished.
- Represent CNH Key Club at various Kiwanis Family events such as District conventions and training conferences.

What makes you stand out as a candidate for the respective position that you are running for?

Ambition. Our District is filled with bright and passionate members, but we need a leader who can transform possibility into reality. When you possess not just a passion but a *drive* for a certain cause, you are willing to go to much greater lengths and put in much more effort to achieve your goals. This kind of determination is exactly how I approach the office of District Governor. The position of District Governor carries a lot of weight, not just because of its status, but also its potential to have a far-reaching impact on the communities throughout the CNH District. As your next District Governor, I will not only serve as a pillar for the District, but also push the boundaries of this position and maximize my potential to bring about change. Another characteristic that distinguishes me is the ability to both learn and problem-solve. This has led me to the realization of how we can truly bring about this 'change' that's so often discussed: marginal improvements. The sheer vastness of the CNH District makes it impractical to implement radical new policies all at once, so instead we need to start fine tuning the little things. From the quality of service, to transparency in communication, to member education, we have a variety of areas that we can build upon and further develop. What defines a truly meaningful contribution to service in Key Club? How have you strived to embody those principles in your contributions?

One thing many people do not realize is that service can take on many forms. In fact, over the course of my 5-year journey in the Kiwanis Family, I have discovered three different forms of service that each have had a profound effect on my understanding of service. The first—and most obvious—definition is physical volunteerism. At first, I was that volunteer, waking up at 7am on the first and third Saturdays of every month for the local 'HOPE' food bank. Later, I became an Executive Assistant for my Division, discovering the second 'pillar' of service: community building. Receiving a warm welcome into the Division environment by presidents and DLT members inspired me to do the same for others. Thus, at every event, I sought to foster an individual relationship with members while creating an environment for them to make new friendships as well. But by far my most treasured contribution in Key Club has been through the value of leadership. The single most powerful tool a person can have is the ability to influence others, and Key Club has allowed me to use that as a force for good. As Lieutenant Governor, I've gotten the opportunity to spark the flame of service in the numerous people I've met. This has been very fulfilling, because while volunteering at an event can have a positive impact on the present, inspiring someone has potential implications for an entire lifetime. This is what has motivated me to run for office of District Governor.

What makes you stand out as a candidate for the respective position that you are running for?

I am (as the people around me like to say) "Key Club crazy." As a Lieutenant Governor, I strived to make my members feel connected to the organization. If I am elected to be your Governor, I will make CNH feel more connected, both within the district's membership but as well as with other branches of the Kiwanis family. My main goal would be to make sure that Key Club is something that sticks with members even if they decide not to stay with the Kiwanis Family. We made care packages with components such as leis, fidget toys, stress balls, and bracelets in between presentation sessions. Seeing the tears in her eyes as she saw our dedication to the cause showed members (and myself) how meaningful our actions are. I made sure they could see the connection between leadership and how that can have an impact on service. This not only educated officers on their duties to their club, but to their community. Anyone can be a leader and promote good quality service that directly impacts their community. Together, we as CNH can change our communities!


