# EVENT IDEAS

## OHANA THANKSGIVING MEAL

Host a joint (Key Club and Kiwanis) Thanksgiving meal for Children in the foster care system. No one should be alone during the holidays. You could do a Thanksgiving Food Drive to collect the desired items such as:

- ★ Turkeys/Ham
- ★ Pies
- ★ Stuffing
- ★ Potatoes
- ★ Gravy/gravy mix
- ★ Salad
- ★ Corn Bread/Bread
- ★ Cranberry sauce

During the event you can also have games, movies, and crafts. Host an event where all leave with full stomachs and hearts.

## KEY CLUB TAKE OVER DAY

Plan with your Kiwanis a day where your Key Club takes over their meeting. You can hold an auction of gift baskets, baked goods, handmade items (paintings, jewelry, etc), and more. In addition, you can have icebreakers and bonding games to get to know your Kiwanians. This event is a great way to build important connections with your Kiwanis clubs and for the members to know who the Kiwanis are.

# EVENT IDEAS

## KIWANIS OHANA EDUCATION DAY

(Aktion Club, K-Kids, Builders Club, Key Club, Circle-K etc)

Hold an education day for your fellow students and invite people from different branches of your local Kiwanis Family.

Some ways you can educate people are:

- ★ Posters (like trifold)
- ★ Pamphlet
- ★ Videos
- ★ Slide presentations

Make sure these education days shine light upon the element of fun across the Ohana!

## KIWANIS FAMILY FUN DAYS

The fun doesn't have to end because the annual Kiwanis Family Fun Day (Oct. 22) is over; Kiwanis clubs across the district hold Family Fun Days monthly. Advertise to your clubs and get members to attend because Kiwanis events are not just for officers! Some events that have taken place in the past are:

- ★ Horse races
- ★ Museum visits
- ★ Zoo visits

Joining your Kiwanians on their Family Fun Days is a great way to connect with your Kiwanians. Plus you get to have lots of fun!

# PROJECT IDEAS

## KIWANIS FUN BAGS

One way Kiwanis clubs promote themselves and gain new members is by making Kiwanis Fun Bags. These bags include the following:

- ★ Meeting info (time, location, days)
- ★ Pamphlets/Kiwanis magazines
- ★ Something fun (craft, puzzle, etc.)

You will be doing a great service to your Kiwanians and your members will learn more about them and gets service hours. It's a win-win situation every witch way.

## FREE BOOK FAIR

When doing big projects, it's a great idea to reach out to your local Kiwanis Clubs. So one idea is to hold a free book fair for kids. Work with your Kiwanians, schools, and local libraries/bookstores to get book donations. Other items you could have are:

- Stickers
- Little toys/stuffed animals
- Cute erasers
- Mini craft kits/coloring kits

The Kiwanis's main focus is on children. Hence, this project is good for kids who may not have access to many books or who may not be able to get a book at normal book fairs.

# PROJECT IDEAS

## HEART/HEATING PADS FOR PEDIATRIC PATIENTS

When kids are in a lot of pain, heating pads can help ease that pain at times. So one way you can help them is to make heart shaped heating pads. Just microwave them for about a minute and you are good to go! The instructions and supplies are listed below:

- Fabric
- Rice
- Sewing thread, needle, and/or sewing machine

- Get an old clean pillowcase/bed sheet or new fabric
- Tip: make a happy face on one side of the heart and a sad face on the other side to help kids communicate their feelings
- A sewing machine is ideal. If one is unavailable, a needle and thread will suffice.
- Note: use rice to fill the plushies, not fiberfill. Use about 8 to 10 cups of dry, uncooked rice grains. You could add some flax seeds in there to help retain heat for a longer period of time.

This is a relatively cheap service project that members could even do at home, so take advantage of it.

# FUNDRAISER IDEAS

## PAINT FOR PEDIATRIC TRAUMA PROGRAM (PTP) - STORE FUNDRAISERS

Partner up with businesses in your town and host fundraisers by painting for PTP. Some businesses you could fundraise with are:

- ★ Pottery painting shops
- ★ Art studios

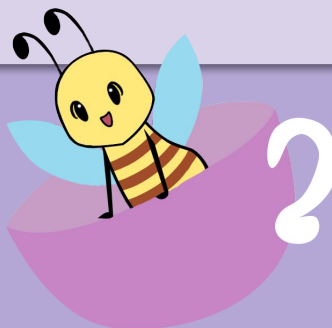
Have a *gourd* time painting!
