MAUI WILDFIRES

All throughout August 2023, the people of Maui in Hawaii have faced a severe set of deadly wildfires due to a combination of land and atmospheric conditions that allow for fires to thrive in. What was expected to last for a day has now extended through several weeks and has impacted the people of the island in many different ways. Although the fires have calmed down, Maui natives are still facing the unwanted repercussions of the firestorms.

HOW TO HELP

Educate yourself on the topic and listen to Maui natives and their stories! Additionally, you can hold service and fundraising events to help garner resources for those affected. In order to receive recognition for helping the people of Maui, clubs can submit their work through the SOSP form, which can be found at tinyurl.com/SubmitSOSP. All submissions are due on the fifth of the following month by 6:00 PM local time.

SERVICE PROJECT ideas

Hold an Emergency Supply Drive

Many people have been displaced because of the recent wildfires and are in need of some necessities. Make a list of items that you want to be collected, such as batteries and flashlights, and even sentimental items like letters, and set up a place where donations can be collected.

No-Sew Blankets

Create easy to make no-sew blankets with two pieces of fleece and attach the layers using the instructions found here. Many citizens are in need of basic resources like blankets so work with your division to make these and send them out.

Hygiene Kits

Maui natives are also in need of hygienic items. Hold different hygiene drives through different events in your community. A good place for this would be at local health or resource fairs, or even at your high school. Work with your division members to assemble kits and distribute them to organizations in Hawaii.

FUNDRAISER

Benefit Concert/Market

Hold a market with local organizations and musicians and have part of the proceeds go to support Maui!

Auction

At a community event, auction off items and donate proceeds to Maui - like auctioning off handmade awareness bracelets.

AWARENESS

Hang up Informational Posters

See if your high school or local coffee cafe is willing to let you put up awareness posters or flyers made by members of your division. On these posters, put brief information about the Maui wildfires and even add a QR code leading to informative websites or a donation site.

Hold Informative Workshops

At local community events, work with members to hold informational workshops or presentations on the Maui wildfires. Redirect community members to donation sites. This will be most effective at events centered around the environment - see if you can link your presentation to July's SOSP focus: BEE Clean, CNH!
