DISTRICT SECRETARY REMARKS

Good Morning, everyone!

First and foremost, I would like to thank you for your continued MRF submissions. Serving as a liaison between yourself and divisions and committees is crucial to the success of the district. When you submit accurate and timely MRFs, you do not only recognize clubs and members for their service and leadership but also contribute to the success of the CNH District.

In the month of July, we were able to achieve 100% On-Time MRF Submissions, and words CANNOT explain how ecstatic I was to see that we were able to reach this impressive achievement. This means that all 75 Lieutenant Governors and 10 Leadership Team Members submitted their MRFs by 6 PM on July 10th. Thank you all for your unwavering dedication to your roles, and I hope we can continue to achieve this for the rest of the term!

On that note, the CNH District has served a total of 65,134.22 hours so far. This is approximately 7.24% of our term goal of 900,000. There is still a long way to go, but I'm confident that we'll be able to increase service hours in the coming months and reach 900,000 hours in no time! Keep up the service and remember that Key Club is, above all, a service organization.

As of June 6th, 2020, MRF Feedbacks have been sent out to all 74 Lieutenant Governors for their May MRF submissions. As of July 6th, June MRF Feedbacks have been sent out to 25 random

Lieutenant Governors. MRF Feedbacks for the July MRF submissions has been sent out also. As I mentioned before, MRF feedbacks are to be continuously sent out to Lieutenant Governors every month.

As a quick reminder, I am reading all of your club, personal, and quarterly reflections, so please be in-depth as possible with your descriptions. The better your reflections, the better I will be able to analyze your needs and assist you during the term.

On July 28th, 2020, The Official 2020-2021 CNH Secretaries Manual has been released. There is a total of 8 sections, including a section on AAR. Because I understand that it may be hard for secretaries to refer back to this lengthy manual frequently, I have split each section in a google drive folder to hopefully make it easier for everyone to refer back to each topic more easily. The manual itself and google drive folder are included in my update email along with other resources, so please make sure that all your secretaries have received and read and understood all the contents of the email.

Through the new CNH Secretary Remind I have released in my District Secretary Update Email, I plan to send out submission reminders every month to your Club secretaries, so please make sure all your secretaries have joined. The Club Monthly Report Form is due to the 5th of each month before 6 PM. Though your Division may identify an earlier deadline for the Division you serve, you must abide by district bylaws and recognize on-time submissions by the 5th.

I would like to take this time to recognize board officers for their continued hard work. Congratulations to the following board officers who have maintained a 100% On-Time submission rate. APPENDIX C: DCON CODE OF CONDUCT CNH | KEYCLUB

Code of Conduct | District Convention | 2020

Every convention attendee must complete this form and submit to the club chaperone. All forms are submitted by the chaperone at District Convention to receive all registration materials.

Purpose: To ensure a safe and purposeful event with expected behaviors consistent with the high ideals of Key Club, the CNH Key Club student leaders with Administration approval have developed this code of conduct as an effective way to clearly state our organization's position on the expected attire, housing accommodations, behaviors, and overall general conduct by all individuals in attendance at District Convention.

Terminology: For the purposes of this code of conduct, the following terminology and definitions will apply.

- "Attendees" will apply to all individuals attending District Convention including but not limited to: Key Club
 members, adults (advisors and chaperones), and invited guests
- "Cuffew" is the designated time that all Key Club members will remain in their assigned rooms from midnight to 5:00
 am.
- "Convention Area Curfew" is the designated time that all Key Club members must be out of the convention area.

"Spirit Attire"

- Shoes: athletic, casual, or dress shoes that cover the heel. AVOID: sandals flip flops, etc.
- **Bottoms:** Worn properly at the waist, ankle length pants in good condition (jeans, slacks, khakis, etc.) or skirts (must reach top of the knee or below). **AVOID:** shorts, leggings, Capris, transparent styles, etc.
- **Tops:** Unaltered t-shirts, sweatshirts, button down dress shirts, blouses or collared shirts that cover the stomach, back, torso, and shoulders. **AVOID:** Logos other than those of the Kiwanis Family or any transparent styles.

"Convention Casual Attire"

- Shoes: athletic, casual, or dress shoes that cover the heel. AVOID: sandals and flip flops, etc.
- Bottoms: Worn properly at the waist, ankle length and unaltered pants (jeans, slacks, khakis, etc.). AVOID: shorts, ripped jeans, leggings, Capris, etc.
- **Tops:** Unaltered convention t-shirts.

"Business Casual Attire"

- Shoes: casual or dress shoes that cover the heel. AVOID: sandals, flip flops, etc.
- **Bottoms:** Worn properly at the waist, ankle length pants in good condition (slacks, khakis, etc.) or skirts and dresses (must reach the top of the knee or below). **AVOID:** jeans, shorts, leggings, Capris, etc.
- Tops: Button down dress shirts, blouses, or collared shirts. AVOID: Tops that show stomach, chest and back.

Expectations: Attendees are expected to adhere to the following conduct.

Dress Code

- Attendees are expected to abide by the designated dress code for the entire event. Members of the current Board, new Board, and Kiwanis Committee will adhere to the dress code established by the Governor and Administrator.
 - Friday: Spirit Attire, Business Casual option
 - Saturday: Business Casual, Business Professional option
 - Sunday: Convention Casual
- Any clothing items deemed to be out of compliance with the defined styles or inappropriate to this event will not be allowed.

Lodging

- Attendees must stay at one of the CNH approved convention hotels and must sleep in their assigned room.
- "Hospitality Rooms" are not permitted.
- No Key Club member is allowed on hotel balconies.
- Female members are not allowed in the room of any male member, and male members are not allowed in the room of any female member at any time. Violation will result in the immediate dismissal from the convention.
- All members are expected to abide by the curfew established by the District Administrator.

Responsible Behavior

- All attendees will respect the authority of the Sergeant-at-Arms committee, Key Club Administrators and designated staff.
- All attendees will abide by all government laws and regulations.
- Attendees may not possess, use, or consume any tobacco, marijuana, e-cigarettes, or vaping products, alcoholic beverages, any drugs or other controlled substance (with the exception of medication prescribed for the attendee), or any weapons, firecrackers, or anything of a dangerous nature.
- Attendees will respect the property of others, conference facility and lodging facility. Any damage caused by an
 attendee must be paid for by that attendee. No signs or materials may be placed or affixed to any hotel or
 convention center window or wall.
- Attendees will not act in any way unbecoming of a Key Club or Kiwanis Family member.
- Attendees are expected to abstain from any activity of a sexual nature.
- Attendees are expected to not tolerate hazing or any action that creates unnecessary physical or mental discomfort, embarrassment, harassment or ridicule of others.
- Attendees will wear their convention name badge and convention wristband at all convention events.
- Attendees have a duty to report infractions of this code of conduct in order to maintain the purpose and safety of this event.
- Attendees must be escorted by a chaperone when going to and from the convention area to hotel rooms.

Enforcement

- Violations of this Code will result in notification to the District Administrator and chaperone.
- Violations involving destruction of property, possession, consumption or use of alcoholic beverages or controlled substances, vandalism, theft, gross insubordination, violence or lodging violations may result in immediate dismissal from the event.
- Within 30 days of the conclusion of the convention, notification of violation of this code by any member(s) disciplined may be made in writing by the District Administrator to the school, sponsoring Kiwanis club, parents of the member(s), and the Kiwanis Executive Director.
- It may be determined by the District Administrator, Service Leadership Programs Director and the Kiwanis Executive Director, that an entire club is in violation of this code of conduct. If so, that club will be suspended from attending the following district convention.
