WHAT'S POPPIN CNH!

Hello and welcome to February 2024! I can't believe I will only be writing two more of these messages before the term is over. It's been such an amazing journey thus far and I can't wait to see what else we will accomplish together!

I would like to remind each and every one of you to **PAY YOUR DUES!** Please keep in mind that it is never too late, so make sure you hold yourself accountable to do so and encourage others as well. Even if your club has sent in dues this term, they are welcome and are encouraged to send in more batches before the term ends. In order to be recognized as an official Key Club member, receive benefits like a membership certificate & pin, as well as qualify to run for officer position, you must be dues-paid. As a district, we have 24,856 dues paid members out of our 32,000 member goal. This puts us at 77.7% of the way there. If each of our clubs encourages 10 more students to pay dues, we will be able to accomplish this goal by the end of the term, which is entirely possible with your help!

Recognition deadlines are quickly approaching so make sure you complete portfolios and report to your secretary on time! MRP, officer contests, and other awards are a great way to be recognized for the hard work and service you've dedicated to our organization, so make sure you go through the simple processes of applying or completing your checklist!

for PUBLIC SPEAKING



1. Preheat your speech by familiarizing yourself with what you are going to say. Do not only rely on your notecards.
2. Add 1 tbsp of clear enunciation. 1 tbsp good and open posture, and a drop of confidence.
3. Combine well by making eye contact with members.
4. Whip until you are projecting your voice.
5. Bake until audience is engaged!

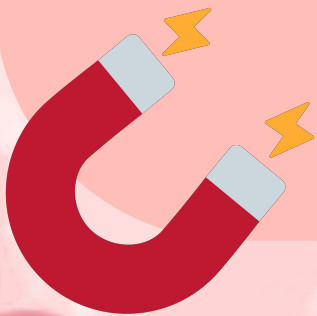

- Conducted **no later than** Convention (DCON)
- **Must meet quorum** (50% of members in attendance)
- Each candidate will **present**
 - All other candidates must be out of the room
- Following their speech, **caucus questions**
 - Any dues-paid member
- Once speeches are complete, **members may vote for each**
 - Ballots **must be collected** by the club's **Faculty Advisor**
 - Ballots must include a "no confidence" if no candidate
- Results will be announced at another club meeting

- Clubs may have candidates **complete documentation** before running (samples found on the CNH CyberKey)
 - Intent to Run Form
 - Service Agreements
- To prepare, candidates should **practice their speech** and **practice answering caucus questions**
- Remember, **campaigning is prohibited** and may result in **disqualification**
 - Candidates **cannot distribute or publicize campaign materials** (ex: posters, flyers, gifts, social media advertisements, etc.)
 - Candidates can respond with **“yes”** when asked if they are running for office
